The Home Residency at DAS is a high-quality intensive programme which offers artists four months to work on a specific project of their choice. Artists will have the opportunity to develop their skills and artistic practice on this enriching programme. DAS encourages applications from artists with innovative and experimental projects.



DAS welcomes proposals from artists from any artform or background who wish to engage with digital technologies to push the boundaries of their own practice. Working alongside a group of peers, the shared studio space provides a productive, dynamic, and safe artistic environment, with additional support available from DAS staff to help artists realise the aims of their residency.

The Home Residency is open to artists based in the UK and Ireland.

Operating since 2003, DAS is proud to have hosted over 200 artists-in-residence. All artists are featured on our website for the duration of their residency.

The DAS Home Residency fee is £70 per month.



Please note there is no lift access in the building.


Facilities at DAS

Applicants should complete the online Google form and submit application materials at https://digitalartsstudios.com/residencies

Project Proposal

Describe your proposed residency project, listing the mediums employed and your level of knowledge in the processes entailed. Outline any specific technical or support requirements. [500 words max.].

CV

Provide a one-page resume describing your academic, artistic, and/other relevant experience. Please include links to relevant websites with passwords where necessary.

Applicants must also provide a BRIEF artist biography and project summary [100 words each max.].

SELECTION.

Artists who wish to work with digital media or technologies who are over 18 years of age are eligible to apply.
Residents are selected by impartial adjudicators on the basis of materials submitted.

In addition to artistic merit, consideration will be given as to whether the artist's practice is likely to benefit from the residency.
